


Picture of elites holding a meeting - an artistic impression




An artistic view of Cotton hill Hillock, Vazhuthacaud in 1891

Few elites of Trivandrum, met on 2<sup>nd</sup> June, 1890 at "Hill View", Thycaud (Later owned by Sri A.N. Thampi) and resolved to start a new club. Thus a club was born with the name "The Union Club". Sir T. Rama Rao, the then ruling Dewan of Travancore, was elected as the first President of the club.


Even now the Club Year extends from 1st June to 31st May.

On the first anniversary day, a resolution was passed requesting the Government to grant a suitable site for the club and a donation for start-up works. The Government acceded to the request with a gift of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  acres of land on the southern side of Cotton Hill at Vazhuthacaud and a grant of Rs.1000.



Government's grant supplemented with Members' contribution brought to reality the first club building within a year. Acceding to the club's request His Highness Sri Mulam Thirunal Rama Varma, Maharaja of Travancore, paid a visit to the new club premises. His Highness also agreed to name the club after him and became the patron of the club. Thus the club was renamed as "Sri Mulam Rama Varma Union Club" in 1892.

K.Krishnaswamy Rao, Sir P. Rajagopalachari, Dewan Bahadur T. Raghaviah, Dewan Bahadur V. Nagamiah, Sri T. Sadasiva Iyer, Mr. M.E. Watts, Sir M. Krishnan Nair, 'Kerala Panini' Prof. A.R. Raja Raja Varma and T. Padmanabha Rao were among the popular office bearers who took keen interest in the development of the club during the initial years.

Dr. C.V. Chandrasekharan, as President of the club (1936-45) took strenuous efforts for improving the club's amenities and membership strength from a meager 35 to 250. Club's name was shortened to 'Sri Mulam Club' during his tenure in the late 1930s.



The Golden Jubilee building was opened on the 50th year of the club's founding.



"A club is not merely a scene for passing diversion and the refreshment and activities for which the body and spirit crave when the day's task is done, but should also be a second home for the cultivation of those qualities which make for good fellowship and healthy citizenship. The distinguished names which adorned the rolls of this club in the past will not only be a memory but a constant stimulus and I have no doubt that the present worthy successors of this tradition will maintain and pass on to coming generations the lofty ideals which are enshrined within this handsome home".

Sir C.P. Ramaswamy lyer donated about 100 books and Rs. 350 towards setting up a club library. Soon a new library named "Sir CP Library" came into being with the efforts of Sri Chidambaram, Hon. Secretary. A Women's Wing and Children's Wing were also started functioning.

Alagappa Hall was dedicated to the club by Nobel laureate Sir C.V.Raman on 1st November, 1945.

The hall was named after Dr. Sir R.M.Alagappa Chettiar from former Madras Presidency. Sri Chettiar was a true philanthropist, education ist & businessman, who do nated handsomely for the construction of the hall.

Alagappa hall has witnessed various events marked in the Travancore history and speeches of eminent personalities from all over India like Sarojini Naidu, Alladi Krishna Swamy Iyer, S. Radhakrishnan and Srinivasa Shasthri.


In 1973, one wooden Shuttle Badminton court was added to Alagappa Hall. A national level Shuttle tournament was conducted to mark the opening of the new court in which the then stars of Indian Badminton like Prakash Padukone, Partho Ganguly, Suresh Goel, Pradeep Gandhe and others descended at SMC.

Dr. Peter B Periera, Trivandrum Bishop and a regular player in the club courts, deserves a special mention for mentoring many ones sporting careers. All Kerala SMC Shuttle Badminton Tournament was a regular feature in the club's sports calendar.

The court has also cradled many illustrious players including Sri U.Vimal Kumar, who won the National Badminton Championship twice and titles like French Open, Welsh Open and SAARC Trophy. He became the first person in the club's history to be conferred with an Honorary Membership for his invaluable contributions in the field of sports.






Community Hall Inauguration by the then Governor of Kerala Smt. Jothi Vengatechellum on 1st September, 1988

From 1980 onwards the club witnessed a catapult in development in terms of infrastructure and facilities, which started elevating it from its humble begins.

Foundation stone for a new restaurant and kitchen block was laid by S. Padmanabhan, District Judge on 21<sup>st</sup> August, 1982. Sri P. Narayanan Nair was the club President. S. Kesavan Nair, club President dedicated the new block to the members on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 1983.

A new guest house with state of the art facilities was added to the club infrastructure by Sri P. Narayanan Nair, club President on 4<sup>th</sup> April, 1987.



Yearlong celebrations were held from 1989 to 1990 to mark the centenary year of the club.


10 Sri Mulam Club | a glimpse on 126 years of social bonhomie
